- II) Weightage for only one highest certificate of value will be considered for determining overall merit. Sports certificates must be of a discipline and tournament recognized by Sports Department, Haryana and Association of Indian Universities.
- III) Teaching experience may be considered only of those candidates who have taught concerned subject (Arts/Sc./Com./B.Ed.) after acquiring the eligibility qualifications.
- IV) For Lecturers appointed in B.Ed. colleges, equal weightage is to be given to percentage M.A/M.Sc./M.Com. and M.Ed.
- V) For SC candidates appearing in SC specific interview, the eligibility would be 50. However, weightage shall be given on acquiring marks at par as per the above criteria.
- VI) SLET shall be only treated as eligibility qualification. No separate weightage shall be given to SLET qualified candidates.
