Scheme of Examination (w.e.f. Session January 2017)

The duration of M. Phil. course will be one year (two semesters). There will be three theory papers in 1st Semester and two theory papers and a dissertation in 2nd Semester. Each theory paper will carry 80 marks and will be divided into four units bearing 20 marks each. There will be an internal assessment of 20 marks in each theory paper. For internal assessment the students are required to present two assignments and one seminar in each theory paper. The medium of the assignments and seminar will be Sanskrit. The dissertation will be of 200 marks (150+50).

Note-Syllabus for Ph.D. coursework will be same as in M. Phil. 1stSemester.
